WILL: of James Doremus of Township of Hohokus, Bergen Co., NJ
dated: 2 June 1851 Pro: 27 March 1857 Filed: Hackensack, NJ
In the name of God Amem. I James Doremus.....

"Item 1st: I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife Polly the old homestead farm where I now live consisting of Forty-five acres of land together with all my personal estate of every kind and description during her natural lifetime and whenever the said Polly may think it proper and convenient she may give to Sarah Goetschius Doremus daughter of Joseph Doremus and born of the body of Polly Sutherland one cow of her own choice, one Bureau,clock and looking glass and four of the best chairs - one bedstead and bedding consisting of one straw bed, one feather bed, pillows and bolster[?] - three blankets, two sheats. The bedstead bedstead to consist of long posts out of the above stated personal property but if my said wife Polly should neglect or refuse to give to the said Sarah Goetschius Doremus the above specific articles in her lifetime then it is my will that my executors herein after named give them to her immediately after my said wife's death.

Item 2: After my said wife's death, I give and devise to my son Joseph all the west part of my farm on which I now live including my buildings and improvements.....

Item 3: "I give and devise to my daughter HANNAH the east end of my farm to extend westerly to the first crop fence along the upland of my farm running northerly and southerly the course of said fence across my farm - unto my said daughter Hannah and to her heirs and assigns forever".

Item 4: I give and devise to my daughter Jane.....

Item 5: The last residue and remainder of my personal estate then remaining after the decease of my said wife as aforesaid, I give and bequeath to my sons Abraham and Joseph, my daughters Hannah and Jane and my grand daughter Sarah Goetschius Doremus to be equally divided among them share and share alike.
