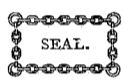

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that Peter H. Post was enrolled on the 27th day of July, 1861, at Longfords N in Co. E, 74th Regiment of New York Volunteers, to serve 3 years or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 20th day of August 1861, at Staten Island, in Co. E, 74th Regiment of New York Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war.

On the Muster Roll of Co. E of that Regiment, for the months of July & August 1862, he is reported Missing in action Aug 29. '62. Regt was in action at Bull Run Aug 29. '62. No evidence of wounds Aug 29. '62 on roll - Roll for July, Aug '63 reports him Corp. absent wounded since July 2. '63. Co was in action at Gettysburg Pa. July 2. '63 - Records on file report him - Transf. to 102nd Co 2 Batt^{on} 7th R. C.

while in the service aforesaid, and in the line of his duty, he received the following wounds: At the battle of 2d Blue Run on the 29th day of August 1862 - he was wounded in action by a bullet striking him in the right leg above the knee and passing through the leg. He was again wounded in action at the battle of Gettysburg Pa July 25 1863, by a bullet striking him in the left wrist and lodging in the arm over the wrist damaging the bones and muscles of the fore arm. He is disabled equal to the loss of a hand or a foot, and he hereby applies for the 3d grade of pension granted by act of June 1866 -

An honorable discharge from the service in all cases is necessary. Declarations of claimants, either for original pension or for increase of pension already granted, must be made before a court of record, or before some officer thereof having custody of his seal; said officer being fully authorized and empowered to administer and certify any oath or affirmation relating to any pension or application therefor.

The claimant's identity and loyalty must be proven by two witnesses, certified by the judicial officer to be respectable and credible, who are present and witness the signing of the declarant, and certify to his identity and loyalty under oath or affirmation.

Declarant's application papers should be as legible and as clear in statement as possible. Where any evidence is already on file in any department of the Government, a definite description of and specific reference to it will render it available in any subsequent claim.

The post office address (naming street and number in all large cities) of the applicant, attorney, and witnesses, should be embodied in or accompany every application, and all evidence in each claim; and each change of residence of said parties, while communicating with the Pension Office or the Pension agents, should be stated.

The fees for the prosecution of claims for pensions will not be allowed to exceed twenty-five dollars; no part of which is payable before the certificate for the pension has been issued.

Pensions are, by law, exempted from any liability on account of the obligations of the pensioners, and no lien upon them can be recognized. All facts, testimony of which is required to establish a claim, must be proven by the affidavits of two or more credible witnesses, unless other evidence is specified.

The statements of claimants, unless duly corroborated, are not accepted as evidence. Testimony in support of allegations made in a declaration, may be taken before any officer whose authority and signature are duly certified, and who shall disclaim any interest, direct or indirect, in the prosecution of the claim.

Persons desiring to complete claims pending at the decease of the claimants, must furnish a duly verified certificate of their authority as heirs or legal representatives.

With all claims for arrears, increase, or restoration to the rolls, the original pension certificate must be returned, or explanation of its absence must be given under oath. To facilitate the adjudication of claims, all the requisite evidence that is available should be forwarded with the application.

Did not see Post again until on the 31st May 1878, when I found him exhausted under the constant discharge from the wound which had continued during the whole period above mentioned, to his death; I then advised an operation at the Hospital to which I accompanied him. & where he died, at Bellevue Hospital N.Y. Did not treat him in the service; Post's death was caused (beyond any doubt) by the gunshot wound, primarily, as the bone was wounded causing pyaemic inflammation of slow progress and consequent suppuration, & death from Pyemia.

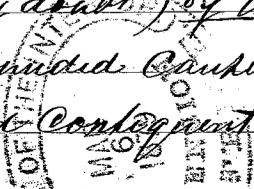

L.S.M. of right leg as rather of thigh is in upper third internal surface and is flesh wound only cutting through adductor muscles. L.S.M. left wrist, extending & deepening about two inches of muscles from carpal articulation up. Hand dislocated from ulna & thumb inward, & hand very much weakened and useless to great extent both rotations almost wanting.

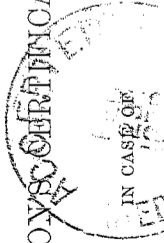

U.S. Left wrist & Right thigh. U.S.W. Left wrist. Ball entire perforated surface about one inch below wrist joint on radial side and did not emerge, but lodged in substance of bone on the soft parts from whence it was removed the following day. Result was complete fracture of lower end of radius with loss of about four inches of that bone from wrist joint up, (wound) flower and fracture and dislocation of hand toward radial side of arm, with articulation end of ulna standing out prominently and very much in the way and liable to injury. Hand is entirely useless for manual labor as shown below the elbow and rating for this disability would be total \$30 per mo

Also U.S.W. Right thigh. Ball entire internal surface about three inches below groin passed upward and outward through perforation of muscles of thigh injuring muscles and nerves in its passage, and caused three inches below and three inches below to be destroyed. Wound was partially healed, would a day and healed well in about three months. Claimant reported that this wound was never repaired entirely well and about three months after the wound broke out and for months the stump paining severely continually discharging, and during that time always had a profuse and granular discharge of blood running in a pipe from the stump up to the anus one inch in length. Discharge is very much augmented by riding and by the use of the cane. Skin is pale and bluish, (nails are soft and glabrous) and several appearances is as if the injury to leg by wound of thigh is very severe and that by injury to nerves as well as muscles, and leg is entirely useless for purpose of manual labor as if cut off above the knee. He cannot stand or walk without crutches. This injury alone would rate at grade of \$24 per mo., but taking the two wounds in connection, I would rate him at first grade or \$31.25 per mo., because the disability is permanent and in such degree as to require the regular presence and attendance of another person to find his disability, as described above, to be equal to, and entitling him to a rating of first grade or \$31.25 per mo. wholly by vicious habits

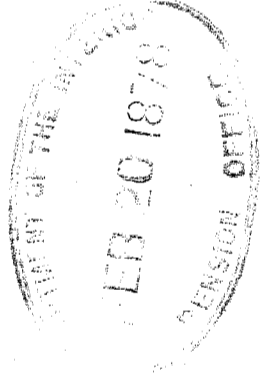
