

**DEED OF CONVEYANCE FROM THE INDIANS
TO ALBERT ZABOROWSKY FOR WEROMENSA**

Whereas in the year 1675. According to the Christian Account Mamshier, the Indian Sachim as also Metecoch & Chechepowas, owners & natural proprietors of several Tracts of Land lying on and above the place where the English have made Division of the Provinces of York and the Jerseys - Did by having Commerce Contract Debts with the subjects of the King of England our Royal Friend and particularly with one Albert Zaborowsky of Hackingsack in the Province of East Jersey, and in order to the discharging the same did give unto the said Albert Zaborowsky a certain Tract of Land by us known by the Name Narachong; but before the same was Regularly by Deed Conveyed unto the said Albert Zaborowsky to the End above, the above named Sachim & owners dyed, & the Tract of Land intended, was by us his successors made over to other Men, and the Debts of the Defunct left unpaid - for the Defraying whereof and the fulfilling the Known Desires of our Dead Bretheran BEE IT KNOWN unto all people and Nations, Before whom this instrument shall or may come, That wee Orachanap alias Metachenah Coorang and Nemeriscon, Have given, granted, made over & confirmed, and by these presents Doe give, grant, make over & confirm unto the said Albert Zaborowsky his Heirs and Assigns All That a Tract of Land Lying on the south east side of Saddle River, beginning on the North East bounds of a certain piece of Land, which Cleass Jansson Romyn of the East Jersey Proprietors, close to the Saddle River, from thence running along the Line of the said Claes Jansson Romyn until it comes to the utmost marked blak oak Tree of his said Line, from thence further beyond the said Tree, until it shall come to a great rock, near about whom a certain Tree marked on all four sides shall be found, from thence in a straight line to a certain small runn, which is easterly just below a certain old Indian field or plantation, Known by the name of Weromensa to a certain peachh tree, marked on all four sides. from thence a straight Course, till it comes to a certain wild cherries Tree or white oak Tree, marked on three sides, and from thence quite to Saddle River, and then along said River, to the place where it began, accounting the said Tract of Land to be one thousand and two hundred acres of English measure, within the Limits & bounds mentioned and specified, provided, that if the said number of acres should perhaps not appear within the said limits, the said Albert Zaborowsky nevertheless shall be contented with such a number as he shall find within the said Limits: And vice versa: If theré should happen to appear greater number of Acres then above specified, that nevertheless we the above named owners shall be also contentd with it, & grant the same over plus by these presents to the said Albertis Zaborowsky his Heirs & Assigns forever to be and Remain to the sole & proper use, Benefit and behoof of Him the said Albertis Zaborowsky his Heirs and Assigns for ever, and Hearby Desire Her Most Sacred Majesty the Queen of England, that she will be graciously pleased to Protect the said Albert Zaborowsky His Heirs & Assigns in the peaceable possession thereof, so that we may never be obstructed in our Just Intentions and fair Dealings with her Subjects - in witness whereof we have hereunto set our hand and fixed our seals, according to the English manner, this first day of June 1702 in the first year of the Reign of the most Sereen Lady Anne Queen of England

DEED BETWEEN ALBRECHT ZABOROWSKY AND THOMAS VAN BUSKIRK

The following is written on the reverse side of the Indian deed to Albrecht Zaborowsky

THIS INDENTURE had, made & concluded at Hackingsack this nine & twenty Day of March in the seventh year of Her Majesties Queen Anne Glorius Reign over Great Brittain, etc. Annoy Domimi one thousand seven hundred & Eight, BETWEEN Albert Zaborowsky of Hackingsack in the County of Bergen in the Province of Nova Caessaria, yeoman, of the one part, And Thomas van Bosserk of the said Town, County & Province, yeoman, of the other part, WITNESSETH, that the said Albert Zaborowsky for divers good and valuable Considerations him thereunto given, HATH given, granted, conveyed, confirmed, made over and assured unto the said Thomas van Bosserk his Heirs & Assigns, All his within mentioned Right, Estate Title, Interest & whatsoever within the premises are to the full true and equal half of the within mentioned tract of Land, situate, lying being and bounded as within specified and limited. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said true, equal and full half of the aforementioned and within expressed Tract of Land and premises, with all & every its appurtenances unto the said Thomas van Bosserk his heirs & Assigns for Ever, unto the only proper use, benefit and behoof of him the said Thomas van Bosserk his Heirs & Assigns for Ever, according to the true intent and meaning of these presents. IN WITNESS whereof the said Albert Zaborowsky hath Hereunto set his hand and seale, the Day and Year first mentioned above written.
