## DEGREES AT CAMBRIDGE

CAMBRIDGE, FEB. 7

At a Congregation held yesterday afternoon, the Vice-Chancellor (Mr. A. B. Ramsay, Master of Magdalene College) presiding, the Regent House approved of a Grace to the effect that Professor Sir J. J. Thomson, M.A., Hon.Sc.D., Master of Trinity College, be appointed the delegate from the University to the Centenary of the British Association for the Advancement of Science, to be celebrated in London on September 23-30, 1931, and to the Faraday Celebrations to be held in London on September 21 and following days.

Mr. J. M. Keynes, of King's College, was appointed an elector to the Knightbridge Professorship of Moral Philosophy until February 20, 1933, in the room of the late Mr. W. E. Johnson.

The recommendations of the Council of the Senate on the establishment of a Professorship of Geography and on the establishment of a Professorship of Experimental Psychology were approved, as also were their recommendations on a proposed benefaction from the Royal Society for the building and equipment of a laboratory for special physical in-

of a laboratory for special physical investigations.

The proposals made by the General Board on the establishment of an additional University Lectureship in the Department of German were passed, as also were their recommendations concerning the establishment of an additional University Demonstratorship in Chemistry.
