

VAN BRESTEDE—BRAISTED—BRISTED—BREASTED, ETC.,  
LINEAGE.

1. JAN<sup>1</sup> JANSZEN, b. in Breeste; m. Englete Jans, who was living subsequent to his death in 1641, in New Albany, and who m. (2) Sept. 1, 1641, in New Amsterdam, Egbert Wouters. The record of this second marriage of the widow of Jan<sup>1</sup> Janszen is thus recorded:—"den 1 Sept. 1641, Egbert Wouters, j. m. Van Yselstejn, en Engel Jan Van Breestede, Wed<sup>e</sup>. Van Janszen" (see *N. Y. Gen. and Biog. Record*, Vol. VII, p. 117, and *N. Y. Gen. and Biog. Soc. Coll.*, Vol. I, p. 11). By this her second marriage she had no issue. Egbert Wouters (or Wouterszen) d. about 1680.

Children: 5 (Van Breesteede), 2 sons and 3 daughters:—

- i. Tryntje<sup>2</sup> Janse, who m. June 3, 1646, in New Amsterdam, Ruth or Rutgers Jacobsen of Rensselaerwÿck whose descendants are now known by the patronymic Rutgers (see *N. Y. Gen. and Biog. Soc. Coll.*, Vol. I, p. 14).
- ii. Dorothea<sup>2</sup> Janse, who m. April 19, 1650, in New Amsterdam, Volckert Janszen from Frederickstadt, and whose descendants comprise the Douw family of New York. He was from Albany, N. Y., and she d. in 1681 (see *N. Y. Gen. and Biog. Soc. Coll.*, Vol. I, p. 16, and *N. Y. Gen. and Biog. Record*, Vol. VII, p. 117).
- iii. Elsje<sup>2</sup> Jans, who m. (1) May 12, 1643, in New Amsterdam, Adriaen Pieterszen Van Alcmaer, a widower (whose first wife was Grietje Pieters) (see *N. Y. Gen. and Biog. Soc. Coll.*, Vol. I, p. 12, and *N. Y. Gen. and Biog. Record*, Vol. VII, p. 117). She m. (2) Hendrick Jochemse of Esopus, N. Y.
- +2. iv. Johannis<sup>2</sup> Jansen, who m. Maritie Andries (or Maritje Lucas). (See forward.)
- v. Frans<sup>2</sup> Jansen, who registered April 17, 1657.

2. JOHANNIS JANSEN<sup>2</sup> VAN BRESTEDE, was of New Amsterdam; he m. Nov. 1, 1647, in New Amsterdam, Maritie Andries (also called Maritje Lucas). She was a daughter of Andries Lucaysen, a skipper in New Amsterdam (see *N. Y. Gen. and Biog. Record*, Vol. VI, p. 37, and *N. Y. Gen. and Biog. Soc. Coll.*, Vol. II, (Vol. I of Baptisms), p. 28). He was a gauger of barrels, and also a fire warden (see *Records of New Amsterdam*, 1653-1674, Vol. II, Folios
